




Multiple Threat Crash

Problem:

First car stops to let pedestrian cross;

First car masks second car, which doesn't stop, hits pedestrian at high speed.








Multiple Threat Solution

Drivers: Never pass a car that could be stopped for pedestrians. It's the law.



Pedestrians: Keep watching for cars. Don't assume other cars will stop because one has.






Multiple Threat Prevention through Traffic Engineering

Advance Stop Bars – can help prevent Multiple Threat crash

First car no longer masks second car, which can be seen by pedestrian.
